Will gave his report on the year's financial activity.

Wiltshire's Best Bat Walks Leaflets and Guided Walks – Laura Loncar

Laura reported that the first Leaflets had been produced in this series and thanked Richard Cassidy for designing these. She announced that there would be Guided Walks taking place to follow the routes of the first two leaflets at:

Jubilee Lake Nature Reserve – Royal Wootton Bassett on 11 May. Led by Gareth Harris and Bob Philpott

River Ebble – Coombe Bissett on 17 May. Led by Gareth Harris and Louise Hartgill

The third leaflet at Waterhay will be coming soon with a walk to launch this in September 2024 and there will be a fourth leaflet with accompanying walk, around Richard Cassidy's wood at Great Cheverell.

Update from the County Recorder – Gareth Harris

Gareth gave a brief run down of the highlights of bat work activity over the past few months. You can read the details of these projects on the Wiltshire Mammal Portal under the WBG publication tab. <u>Publications – Wiltshire Mammal</u> <u>Portal (wordpress.com)</u>

Gareth announced that work would be beginning to produce the next edition of Mammals in Wiltshire as increased records, many generated by members of the Bat and Mammal groups had generate significant increases in our knowledge of key species, as well as new species to add.

Gareth reported on survey results from ongoing work at Salisbury Cathedral where 14 species have been recorded.

He showed video from the new Bat House at Standlynch Farm which is attracting several species including Greater Horseshoe Bats.

He announced that the Savernake Forest Survey Projects was receiving new funding from Forestry England, which will mean an expansion of the project and a need for more volunteers to help.

Members are encouraged to submit all bat records, via iRecord or our excel template recording form.

Wiltshire Bat Group Principles

- Bat Group members should be champions and ambassadors for bat conservation raising the profile and public awareness of bats.
- Bat Group Members should promote and encourage data recording, forwarding their bat records to the Wiltshire Bat Group County Recorder.
- Experienced bat workers should provide training opportunities for the next generation of volunteers, including effective engagement with the public, safe handling, bat ID and surveying techniques.
- The Bat Group will establish and maintain effective partnerships with other bat groups, statutory bodies and conservation organisations.
- Bat Group Members should be courteous to each other, show respect, act with integrity at all times, communicate openly and adhere to the conditions of licences.
- Bat Group members should respect and adhere to National Guidelines relating to personal safety and bat welfare at all times.
- Bat group members engaging with, referencing or representing the Wiltshire Bat Group to the media should ensure they are delivering accurate, balanced and consistently professional messages aligned with the values of the group, and national bat conservation initiatives.
